So, to reach out to as many people as possible we would like to raise greater awareness of the services Longfield Community Hospice provides, build stronger relationships and partnerships with healthcare professionals, community groups and the general public. As a Community Engagement volunteer, you will be representing Longfield at events throughout Gloucestershire on and off site.	
Time commitment:	A few hours per month – may include evenings and weekends	

### Tasks and activities

- To represent the hospice providing information, referral pathway guidance and general knowledge of Longfield Community Hospice.
- Responsible for the manning of stalls /stands raising awareness to the general public and to other health care professionals and providers at organised events.
- Handing out information about Longfield, answering questions and talking to people on a one to one or group basis about our services.
